Safety

Most of us are aware of the fact that carbon monoxide is a colorless, tasteless, invisible gas generated by incomplete combustion. Although it is also odorless, it can be present in other gases / vapors that do have an odor.

Recently, a water company field service representative was exposed to carbon monoxide (CO) gas while changing a meter in a customer's residence. The source of the CO was natural gas leaking from a faulty pilot light on a nearby hot water heater.

Physical signs of carbon monoxide poisoning include dizziness, nausea, light headedness, and overall weakness. This is caused when this gas displaces the amount of oxygen within our body.

Although this was a very isolated, unusual situation, we want to ensure that we adhere to the following precautions in an effort to prevent similar accident / exposure recurrence:

- Be aware of any unusual, peculiar odors (i.e. natural gas, vehicle exhaust smell) when working, regardless of the location. When in doubt, err on the safe side and test the air to ensure proper atmospheric levels are present.
- Be cognizant of the physical effects of carbon monoxide exposure and, if experiencing any of them, leave the area in question and get into a fresh air environment.
- If exposure to carbon monoxide gas has been confirmed, pure oxygen should be administered by a medical professional.

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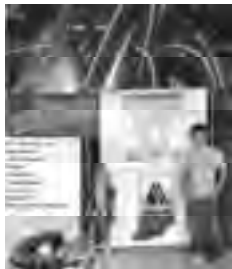

The Indiana Section's Emergency Response Committee and Education Committee will co-host the Second Annual Meeting of the Indiana Water/Wastewater Agency Response Network (InWARN).

This meeting is sponsored by the USEPA and will be held at the Indianapolis Marriott Downtown on Friday, August 28, 2009. The Meeting will begin at 9:00 a.m. EDT, local time and end by 4:00 p.m. Depending upon attendance and time constraints, we hope to offer a tour of the State's Emergency Operations Center.

An Emergency Response Tabletop Exercise will be offered as part of the Annual Meeting to step through InWARN's emergency response operational plan and protocols, including those used to request mutual aid/

assistance from neighboring utilities. The Tabletop Exercise on a likely Midwest emergency scenario is being provided by and through the USEPA. Presentations on using the water and wastewater resource typing system and the InWARN Webpage will also be given. Water and wastewater managers and operators are encouraged to attend and will be able to obtain continuing education credits for maintaining their operator certifications.

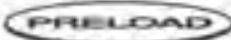
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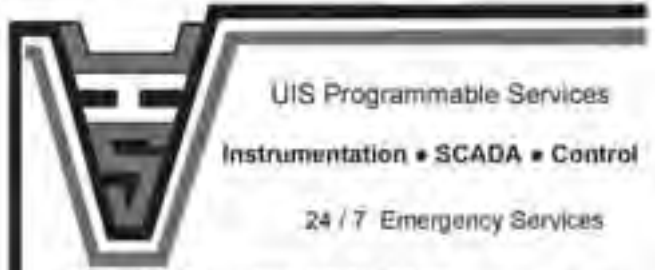


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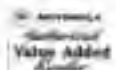
